CHIEF'S REPORT

The Fire and EMS response and transport reports for the month of October was provided. Eighty-One total responses for the month and thirty-nine EMS responses with twenty-two transports for the month.

Paige Wood has completed all conditional requirements and starts November 16th. On November 15th she takes the AEMT written test, will schedule the practical exam. She will be on preplanned vacation Dec. 17-31.

Chief Eastman reported E3411 was in a minor motor vehicle accident while providing mutual aid to the City of Walla Walla for a structure fire on Clinton Street. Little to no damage was done to E3411 and an estimate of \$4,000 worth of damage to the other vehicle.

GEMT cost report for FY2022 is completed and will be submitted by our consultant. The cost increased from \$3,864 to \$4,495 per transport for Medicaid patients.

Deputy Chief Golden reported the bids were released for two-Type 4 bed boxes and tanks. Chassis', beds and tanks should be arriving around the same time. Bid opening is scheduled for December 14th meeting.

Deputy Chief Golden advise the GESA grant funds should be arriving by November 23rd. Grant Funds are allocated to the purchase of vehicle back-up cameras and thermal imaging cameras.

Chief Eastman will be on Vacation through the 21st and Deputy Chief Golden will be on vacation Nov 17th – 20th.

On Nov. 28th Chief Eastman and Brandon McKinney will go to South Dakota to inspect tenders, before delivery. Then on Dec. 11 Chief Eastman and Deputy Chief Golden will travel to Chehalis for final inspection of ambulance, provided a passed inspection they will drive the ambulance home.
